My name is Francisco Javier Reyes, middle child of five children. I was raised in Valparaiso, a small town in the north central Mexican state of Zacatecas. I started my vocational journey in a Diocesan Seminary when I was fifteen and after completing my M.Div. in Theology, I moved to the United States and joined the

Claretian Missionaries. After receiving my MA in 2012, I began a pastoral year working in Campus Ministry at Dominican University, River Forest Illinois. My role there was as coordinator of a leadership development and faith formation program for undergraduate students interested in experiencing faith-based service in the Latin community in Chicago and the surrounding suburbs. It was truly a blessing seeing the students grow as leaders for the Church and with an open heart for all those that live in the margins of our society.

I professed my perpetual vows with the community on August 15 and I was assigned as a Pastoral Associate for CCM. with the hope that I will be ordain as a Deacon in November 5th. If you have asked me five years ago if I saw myself doing this ministry, the answer is no. But I have always believed that God has a plan. Pope Francis, in his encyclical Evangelii Gaudium, has invited us all to practice the "art of accompaniment" which teaches us to remove our sandals before the sacred ground of the other (169). At the same time, I want to allow myself to be accompanied by the students and staff; trusting in God's work. As I embark in his new adventure, I ask for your prayers and support that I may continue to be open to the guidance of the Holy Spirit and faithful to God's call.
