Reflection by Fr. Tom

“You cannot serve both God and mammon” (Luke 16:13). No one in church today would question this teaching of Jesus. No one would ever think this teaching is addressed to him or her. No one. And none of Jesus’ listeners would ever have thought Jesus’ words were directed to themselves. No one. Nor do we. Perhaps we can think of others to whom these words might be applicable, but not us. John L. McKenzie, in his Dictionary of the Bible, notes that the word *mammon* occurs four times in the New Testament and never in the Hebrew scriptures. When it does appear in the targums and the Talmud, it usually means property and this includes money but is not restricted to it. McKenzie points out that when it is used in rabbinical writings, it often has a negative connotation. McKenzie also notes that the word sometimes takes on the personification of a god. This reminds me of Good Friday’s reading of the Passion. Pilate asks, “Do you want me to release to you the King of the Jews?” They cried out again, “Not this one but Barabbas!” (John 18:39b-40). The name, Barabbas, means “son of the father.” In John 8:41, Jesus said to his accusers, “You are doing the works of your father!” A few verses later, Jesus spoke of the devil as “the father of lies” (John 8:44). In the Passion, when the shouters call for Barabbas, they are asking not for Jesus, the Son of the Father, but for another who is the son of the devil. They chose mammon. They did not choose the one who was sent by the Father. They chose the one sent by the devil who wanted to usurp the Father’s Kingdom. They chose mammon. Jesus turned his world upside-down. He didn’t promise people the foolish dreams of a civil insurrectionist; he promised the cross. “You cannot serve both God and mammon.” You can’t pick up your cross and expect to do your own will, to live your own life. Mammon will give you security, your own will, Barabbas; Jesus offers the cross, sacrifice, salvation with God in the Kingdom. What will you choose?

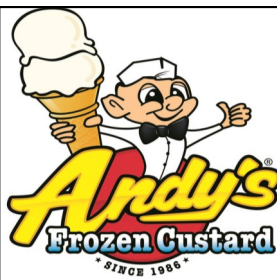
