Reflection by Javier, CMF

The Gospel of Luke this Sunday presents us with a unique story. Jesus is travelling among the "border people" of Samaria and Galilee, those whom Pope Francis refers to as being on the periphery of society. In this specific place a miracle a healing miracle takes place. A group of ten lepers called out to Jesus for healing. According to Jewish law, leprosy was not simply a personal disease; it had societal implications as well. Those who suffered from leprosy had to dwell apart from the rest of Jewish society, since at that time it was believed that the disease was contagious.

Jesus is walking among those who are doubly on the periphery: they live on the borders of Israel and they are pushed to the margins of society. To them, Jesus speaks a word that both heals them and reconciles them to the community. It was only the priest who could declare someone healed of leprosy and therefore able to be re-integrated into Jewish society. According to Jewish law, Jesus was doing exactly what ought to be done: "Go, show yourselves to the priests." But only the Samaritan, recognizing that he has been healed, goes beyond the confines of the Jewish law, and returns to the very source of his healing. And by doing so, he receives the greatest gift: the promise of salvation.

So the Gospel today invites us to reflect on a number of things: whether we draw boundaries that God does not draw; whether we allow our fears to limit how we allow God to work through us; how we relate to those on the periphery; How we go beyond the demands of our times and acknowledge God's grace working in our lives; and lastly, how we allow God's healing and reconciling power to work through us in ways that we did not always anticipate, and in ways that we sometimes are not prepared for.

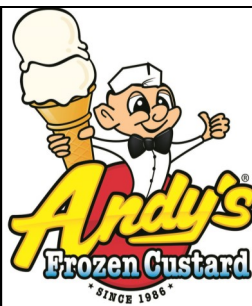
